- NSF-MRI grant not approved. LC-QTOF-MS pre-proposal resubmitted to Murdoch Charitable Trust.
- New services started: optical microscope tune-up services and equipment loans. New Chromatography "boot camp" may be started.

- Plan to have regularly scheduled monthly STS Advisory Council meetings. Day and time to be finalized.
- The council discussed the goals of the two new working groups: Optical Microscopy and Chromatography-MS

 - Looking further ahead and more broadly at assets/staffing/financial support/space
 - o Get feedback from STS Advisory Council and seek out interested faculty
- WWU's need for better communication between PIs writing large grant proposals, and departments clearly defining what is needed regarding equipment, staffing, and space.
 In particular, the new STEM 1 building – status, steering committee and occupancy.
- Council discussed possible resubmission of NSF-MRI grant proposal and prioritizing equipment
